Exercise measured by functional gains should be the mainstay of physical therapy for most musculoskeletal injuries and treatment that does not actively engage the worker is not generally indicated beyond the first few weeks post incident/surgery. Majoris defines passive from the viewpoint of the injured worker, meaning that even if treatment requires action from the therapist, if it does not require action and engagement from the worker it is considered passive.
